

While going through some of her papers and files, Kay Hardesty came across a poem written by her mother, LaVaun Wallace. According to LaVaun's journal, "My Salvation" was written at 6:45am on Thursday, February 2nd, 1984. Kay remembers her mother writing in that journal whenever something came to mind, one of the ways she expressed her gratitude to God. Her faith saw her through the end of her first marriage and all the other struggles she encountered during her life. "She loved the Lord and always said her prayers," Kay observed.

LaVaun's witness to God's love in her life was not limited to writing, church attendance, or prayer. It shone through in her years as a loving, supportive mother. "When I was involved in Scouts, she was right there with me," Kay said.

In the years LaVaun lived in nursing homes, she shared her faith whenever she could; she was always willing to sit and talk with someone at dinner or Bingo or while she worked on an art project. She was well-loved by the nursing home staff and residents alike.

This brief snapshot of LaVaun reveals someone who had a deep desire for a closer relationship with God. A regular practitioner of journaling, prayer, gratitude, worship, and witness, she did not limit herself to one practice but instead reached out to God through a variety of them, in times of joy and sorrow, both daily and when the moment struck.

Thank you to Kay, who with love, gratitude, and grief for her mother shares this poem with us. As you read LaVaun's words 41 years later, may you be reminded that you are a beloved child of a God who is always with you. May you continue to explore and practice the spiritual disciplines that draw you closer to God, that your life may reveal the life-changing love of Jesus to others, just as LaVaun's did.

- "Oh! What a beautiful, wonderful day when I let Jesus have his way.
- He came into my life of sin and cleansed my soul from within.
- "Now are you washed in the blood of the lamb?" I replied to him, "I know I am!"
- Such happiness filled my soul with love when he smiled at me from above.
- "My child," he said, "I have work for you, because with your life, I'm not through.
- Into your life will come much strife and sorrow. Put your hand in mine and face tomorrow."
- He showers me with countless blessings every day since I asked him into my life to stay.
- I praise him with songs, the old and the new. His message is there, plain, for me and you."
